# Rowing Report – 7 November, 2017

- Maintenance Coordinator: **Vacant.** Suggestion was to initiate a new/different recording system for repairs and run regular Working Bees
- o Regatta Secretary: Mr Rodney Silcox & Mr Simon Gills
- Sports Coordinator: Mr Simon Gills
- o Treasurer: Reports to be prepared by Shalom Finance and distributed to Meetings by Mr Simon Gills
- Rowing Captains 2018: There will be no formal Rowing Captains for 2018 with all Year 12s being asked to take a leadership role within Shalom Rowing and at Regattas
- Our End of Year Celebration/Break Up was held Saturday October 21 from 5:30pm with presentations, pizza and drinks plus bombardment. A 'Blessing of the Fleet' is planned for the start of the 2018 rowing season
- Shalom Rowing handed out Come & Try Session flyers at the Yr7 2018 Orientation afternoon yesterday. We will also conduct a small presentation for current Yr6 classes at both St Mary's and St Patrick's in the last week of November
- Our Learn to Row Sessions for 2018 Year will be held Saturday 18 & Sunday 19 November and Saturday 25 & Sunday 26 November. Times are 7:00am to 8:30am and 8:30am to 10:00am. Everyone welcome
- With the changes to Bundaberg Rowing Club Membership Fees for 2018: \$175 for 6 months to June 30 (which would include HOR & CQ) & \$350 for full calendar year to December 31. It was decided that for the 2018 year SRSG would subsidise each school rower's membership up to June 30. Therefore, each school rower would pay \$150 only to Shalom Finance (for the first 6 months) with the additional \$25 to be funded from Shalom Rowing. Obviously if paying for the full calendar year up front, it would be \$325 only. All new rowers would also receive a FREE Shalom Rowing Shirt and Hat. ANY rower wanting a Jacket would need to pay \$60. All existing rowers who required a new Shirt & Hat would need to pay \$60
- This year for Shalom Rowing we have had two major fundraisers our Annual High Tea and the inaugural Golf Day. These were both great days and we look forward to holding them again next year
- A positive for the year has been the construction of the new Gym/Fitness Centre and the employment of a trainer to look after our rowers. This is a bonus for our rowers as they can all work on increasing their strength and fitness on the campus. Many of the rowers have had a personal training program developed which will pay off in the long run
- The SRSG fleet has been improved by the acquisition of three second-hand racing sculls which have all been enjoyed by our rowers at recent regattas. At the start of the year we purchased a Swingulator which has been used to further improve technique of our rowers
- Our main drive now will be around trying to sign-up more rowers into our program. Rod Silcox is also keen to hear from anyone who might be interested in coaching up to HOR next year
