Selection information: The study of core subject areas is compulsory for all students. These are automatically selected for students. This includes Religious Education, English, Physical Education, Science and History (1 semester only).

- Students must select one Mathematics subject to study. This can be either: General Mathematics OR Mathematical Methods. Please indicate your choice by circling your preferred subject to study.
- Students must select 3 elective subjects (each studied for 1 semester).
- Students must select 3 reserve elective subjects.
- If a student is wanting to study Japanese they must first select Japanese as an elective before opting to select the second elective Japanese (Extension). Students can study one or both of these electives.

While only three elective subjects are studied, it is important that students select only the subjects that they are prepared to study.

Choices should be made carefully and in order of preference with 1 being the choice with the highest preference and 6 being the choice with the lowest preference.

Students may not be able to study all of their first three preferences. They may need to study one of their other preferences. It is important they have ordered their subject preferences carefully.

Once the timetable is constructed subject changes cannot be guaranteed due to the line structure.

Students cannot choose the semester order in which the subjects will be studied, this will be dictated by the timetable.
